









The University of Salerno is ideally linked to the oldest academic institution in the Old Continent: the Schola Medica Salernitana. Founded in the eighth century AD, the School reached its peak between the 10th and 13th century. In addition to medicine, its lectures included philosophy, theology and law. The School, which earned Salerno the title of *Hippocratica Civitas* (City of Hippocrates) after the famous Greek physician and treatise writer, was closed by royal decree in 1811 under Joachim Murat's Napoleonic government. In 1944, by decree of king Victor Emmanuel III, the Istituto Universitario di Magistero "Giovanni Cuomo" was founded. This became state-owned in 1968. changing its name into Facoltà di Magistero dell'Università degli Studi di Salerno. Within a few years, the Faculty was joined by many others, which contributed to the formation of a major university. The Faculty of Arts was established in 1969. This was followed by the Faculty of Economics (1970); the Faculty of Mathematical, Physical and Natural Sciences, and the Faculty of Law (1972); the Full Degree in Engineering (1983); the Faculty of Pharmacy (1991); the Faculty of Political Science (1992); the Faculty of Foreign Languages and Literature (1996); finally, the Faculty of Medicine and Surgery (2006). As of 1987, the University is located in the town of Fisciano, a few kilometers from Salerno, at the junction of motorway intersections that make it central and easy to reach. The university is a very large compound in continuous expansion, covering around 100,000 square metres. Organized in the form of a campus (comprising the campuses of Fisciano and Baronissi), the university is equipped with residence halls for students and teachers, and boasts modern facilities and efficient services for orientation, teaching, studying and leisure activities. It currently counts about 40,000 students from Campania, Basilicata, Calabria and Apulia.

The University of Salerno represents one of the most important scientific and cultural institutions of Southern Italy. With its 40,000 students, this modern and dynamic university succeeds in meeting international challenges while being at the same time strongly rooted in the local community.

The university has grown over time, establishing itself as a reference center for education, designed on the needs of the students and in line with the evolution of the world of work, as well as an accredited institution for the quality of its research. According to the rankings of state universities issued by "II Sole 24 Ore", the University of Salerno ranks 15th on the list and records the highest growth, confirming its leading position in the Italian Centre-South among 61 national universities These data are corroborated internationally, as shown by the latest Times Higher Education rankings, the most authoritative international publication assessing the performance of thousands of world universities in all their fundamental objectives: teaching, research, knowledge transfer and internationalization. In 2018, having entered the list only a year before, the University of Salerno immediately

reached the top 400 universities worldwide. Recently, our institution has also entered for the first time the most consulted rankings on the quality of world universities, the QS World Rankings 2020, while in the latest CENSIS survey UNISA came 6th among Italy's Large State Universities based on service quality and livability.

To this day, with the experience gained over the years as Rector. I believe that the success of our university is to be found in the sense of community, familiarity and organization that our institution inspires in its "citizens". At the University of Salerno you do not just study. You live, and therefore you grow. Students, as well as staff, have the opportunity to use their living and working time within one large space which with its numerous services and facilities welcomes and meets the most diverse needs. In order to maintain high guality standards, the "Costruendo UNISA" programme was introduced, aimed at the recovery and constant upgrading of university facilities and spaces. A greater level of safety and a better quality of life for the users are the hallmarks of what in time has come to be known as the "New Campus". The teaching offer of UNISA is among the largest and most

varied in Southern Italy. The numerous courses range from life and health sciences to the hard sciences from the humanities to the legal and economic-political field, to engineering. In addition to the 80 bachelor's and master's degree courses, there is a wide range of postgraduate courses which include courses for teacher training, postgraduate and specialization courses, PhD programmes, postgraduate schools. The "Manifesto degli Studi" of the University of Salerno is updated every year on the basis of the local and national economic-productive scenario, and on the analysis of employment demand. A key factor sets us apart and rewards us as a campus: constant attention to the centrality of the student, "UNISA PER GLI STUDENTI" (UNISA FOR THE STUDENTS) is not just a slogan. Ours is the first university in Italy to have promoted and implemented the socalled Policy of Merit: full reimbursement of fees for students who have finished all the exams of their annual study plan within the prescribed time. From 2015 to date, the university has written three cheques of around 3 million euros each to repay fees for around 9,000 deserving students. In these vears of hard commitment, we have seen an

increase in the number of graduates obtaining their degree in the expected time. In fact, from 2013 to date, students who graduated within the legal duration of their study course have increased by 113%, going from 997 to 2.125. Not only that: even those enrolled between 2013/14 and 2018/19 grew by 19%, a significant percentage for a University of Southern Italy. These figures are a proof of the importance that our university has given to the right to study. The further objective of strengthening the university's international character has been pursued, as a priority. since the beginning of my term of office. International cooperation agreements, double degrees, incoming and outgoing mobility programmes both for study and traineeships, strengthening of the teaching offer in English, international scholarships, Italian language courses for foreigners and new tools for institutional multilingual communication contribute to the shaping of graduates with solid skills, young professionals who are able to face the challenges of the global labor market and contribute to the growth process of the local economy. 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Orientation plays a strategic role in the architecture of the university system, as it represents an efficient information tool and a major educational vehicle for students. Indeed, the development and valorization of integrated orientation policies between school, university and the world of work can help young people develop planning skills, facilitate a rational choice of the future study programme, and greater awareness of the student's aptitudes and abilities. Since the year 2000, the CAOT (Centro di Ateneo per l'Orientamento ed il Tutorato -University Centre for Orientation and Mentoring) has developed many initiatives and services to promote the culture of orientation within the University and the larger territorial context connected to it. The results achieved in these past years of hard work, both in quantity and quality terms, have added to the conviction that effective orientation policies constitute an integral part of the University's educational function and that, through the commitment of all academic parties, it is possible to further strengthen initiatives designed for students, in order to facilitate well-thought

out choices, a faster accomplishment of academic goals, and a quicker access into the world of work.

The Guide to the University of Salerno here presented is a communication and orientation tool which is highly appreciated by students, families, high school and university teachers from Italy and abroad. The text is enriched and integrated by multimedia contents (downloadable with a special app) which, through the use of pictures videos and audios enable the user to freely navigate information and learn more about the resources provided by the University, with particular reference to courses, campus life, facilities, services, cultural and sports activities. Available in Italian, English, Spanish and Chinese, the Guide is now in its 16th edition. and is issued in about 25,000 copies every year. It is also distributed during UnisaOrienta, an orientation event held annually in collaboration with the University's departments. In 2019, the event was attended by over 18,000 students and 800 high school teachers. Finally, I would like to express my heartfelt

thanks to Rector Prof. Aurelio Tommasetti for the confidence granted to myself and those who constantly contribute to the work of the University Centre for Orientation and Mentoring.

A "GREEN" UNIVERSITY

Universities are provided with an operational structure whose functioning makes an impact on the economy, on society and on the environment. Their institutional role requires that they be a reference model for the entire community which they address, directing the behaviour of the other players of the social and economic world. This assumes an even greater importance for university campuses due to a specific peculiarity: the possibility of experimenting, on a reduced scale, project solutions and organizational systems for sustainability to be disseminated in the region involved as "best practices". Therefore, a dual commitment is associated with the institutional role of universities: being sustainable and committing to sustainability. It follows that universities should promote commitment according to the renowned 17 Sustainable Development Goals - SDGs. In this perspective, the University of Salerno has for years implemented specific policies for the sustainability of the campus in the economic, social and environmental sectors, in terms of improving and reducing the environmental impact of its activities, thus outlining the profile of what a sustainable campus aims to be. The commitment of UNISA has made it possible to dedicate, to the projects and activities designed for this purpose, both the indispensable resources in terms of knowledge and experience and the necessary economic resources. In fact, especially in the past two years, the university has strategically bid on the efficiency and modernization of its processes and has therefore begun to optimize the times and costs of individual activities, thus improving effectiveness, commitment and attention to students, to their families and to the entire community. The strategy that the University of Salerno has outlined to guarantee increasing levels of sustainability to its activities aims, in particular, at: 1. the improvement of the already good energy performances, by increasing the production from renewable sources and optimizing the energy performances of the existing buildings to conform them

requirements;

- 2. the optimization of the integrated waste management, by promoting the implementation of systems for the valorization and reuse of waste;
- 3. the valorization and the open, integrated development of knowledge.

In particular, the university's energy planning focuses on three fundamental directions: the self-production of electricity and thermal energy from renewable sources, the improvement of the energy performance of the buildings in the two campuses, and finally the "Costruendo UNISA" program, i.e. the construction of new LEED Gold energy class buildings which bring about significant energy savings with lower atmospheric emissions compared with traditional building technologies. The university's energy planning will receive an additional boost from the already funded Renewable Energy Plan, aimed at making the campuses totally self-sufficient. Furthermore, for the purpose of optimizing the integrated waste management, a new plan for separate collection and the "Plastic Free" project were recently launched. The commitment of the University of Salerno and the results achieved in the field of sustainability are evidenced by the results of the survey "UI Green Metric World University Rankings 2018", which ranks the commitment of academic institutions worldwide in the development of "environmentally friendly" university infrastructures. The University of Salerno, on the basis of the scores received for each indicator, ranked 214 among the world universities, recovering 80 positions compared to 2017 (294th place). Among the indicators for which Salerno performed best are the organization of spaces and new infrastructures created for energy saving and environmental sustainability. In the Italian ranking, the University of Salerno is in 12th place and is the only university in the Center-South, together with Bari, to have entered the top "green" universities in Italy.





UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE, RESEARCH AND TEACHING ORGANIZATION



MAIN GOVERNING BODIES Rector (*Rettore*)

The Rector is the legal representative of the University and is responsible for orientation. promotion and coordination of research and teaching activities. The Rector is responsible for the pursuance of the University's institutional goals according quality criteria and in conformity with principles of efficacy, efficiency, transparency and merit. In the exercise of his or her functions the Rector relies on a Vice Rector and Delegates, chosen by him or her within the university. The Rector of the University of Salerno is Prof. Aurelio Tommasetti, whose term of office expires on 31 October 2019. As of 1 November 2019, the new Rector is prof. Vincenzo Loia

Vice Rector (Prorettore)

The Vice Rector, appointed among full-time tenured professors, substitutes for the Rector in his or her functions in case of absence or impediment.

Academic Senate (Senato Accademico)

The Academic Senate establishes the university's policy and its cultural and

scientific orientation. It also contributes to developing the university's strategic planning and has regulatory, proactive, advisory, coordinative and controlling functions over the university's research and teaching programs. The head of the Academic Senate is the Rector.

Administrative Board (*Consiglio di Amministrazione*)

The Administrative Board has strategic and supervisory functions over the financial sustainability of all activities within the University.

The head of the Administrative Board is the Rector.

College of Auditors (*Collegio dei Revisori dei Conti*)

The College of Auditors has control over the university's financial management and accounting.

University Evaluation Unit (*Nucleo di Valutazione di Ateneo*)

The University Evaluation Unit is responsible for the internal evaluation of research and teaching activities as well as actions to support study by guaranteeing the fair use of public resources, the productiveness of research and teaching, the impartiality and good conduct of administration.

Director General (Direttore Generale)

The Director General, in accordance with the guidelines provided by the Administrative Board, supervises the overall management of services, instrumental resources and administrative staff. The Director General of the University of Salerno is Enrico Periti.

OTHER GOVERNING BODIES Board of Department Heads (*Collegio dei Direttori di Dipartimento*)

The Board of Department Heads, made up of the heads of all departments, is an advisory and proposal-making board which deals with general issues of promotion, development, coordination, research and teaching evaluation.

Student Council (*Consiglio degli studenti*)

The Student Council is the official body of the students. It has proposal-making and advisory functions towards the Rector, the

Academic Senate and the Board of Directors. It is composed of thirty students elected according to specific regulations. The members of the Council remain in office for two years and can be immediately re-elected only once.

Central Committee for the promotion of equal opportunities, workers' welfare and non-discrimination (CUG)

The CUG is a guarantee institution against all forms of direct or indirect discrimination deriving from various risk factors as set out in European legislation: gender, age, sexual orientation, ethnic origin, disability and language, occurring in the workplace, education, career advancement and safety.

University Sports Committee (*Comitato per lo Sport Universitario*)

The University promotes sports activities for students and staff. The University Sport Committee coordinates sports activities for the whole university community and supervises the management of sports facilities and related activities.

RESEARCH AND TEACHING ORGANIZATION Departments

The Department is the core organizational structure for the conduction of scientific research, educational and training activities, as well as external activities related to them, including collaborations by contract or agreements with other institutions. The departments are made up of teachers and researchers from similar study fields, grouped on the basis of a common scientific and cultural pursuit.

In particular, the Department promotes and coordinates research activities, plans and supervises the organization and carrying out of teaching activities related to one or more degree, PhD, postgraduate and specialization courses.

The Department's governance is composed of the Director (*Direttore*), the Department Council (*Consiglio di Dipartimento*), and the Department Board (*Giunta di Dipartimento*).

Didactic Councils (Consigli Didattici)

The Didactic Council is the organization responsible for the coordination of one or more degree courses belonging to the same

class and/or Master's degree course, in accordance with the instructions of the Department in charge.

Interdepartmental Research Centres (Centri di ricerca interdipartimentali)

Interdepartmental Research Centres can be established to coordinate particularly challenging research projects which are common to multiple fields of study, and may last several years.

ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS



GUIDE TO THE UNIVERSITY OF SALERNO 2019 - 2020 ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS

In accordance with the principles of the Constitution of the Italian Republic and the Magna Charta signed by European and extra-European universities, the University of Salerno states its public function, secularism, pluralism and independence from any ideological, political and economic orientation. The University guarantees, within its premises, freedom of thought and association. As its primary purpose, it pursues the development and transfer of knowledge by promoting and organizing research. It also attends, through coordinated actions, to the cultural and vocational training of the students, as well as their civil growth. The University issues qualifications of different levels provided for by law, in accordance with university regulations. Qualifications are organized as shown below.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE (LAUREA)

Bachelor's degree programs last three years (180 ECTS credits) and may be organized into different curricula. They aim at providing students with adequate mastery of methods and general scientific contents, as well as the acquisition of specific professional skills.

MASTER'S DEGREE (*LAUREA MAGISTRALE*)

Master's degree programs consist of two additional years (120 ECTS credits) to the three-year Bachelor's degree, and may be organized into different curricula. They aim at providing students with advanced training to perform high-qualified activities in specific sectors.

SINGLE-CYCLE MASTER'S DEGREE (LAUREA MAGISTRALE A CICLO UNICO)

Single-cycle Master's degree programs do not involve a 3 + 2 (Bachelor + Master's Degree) system, but rather a single Master's degree program lasting 5 or 6 years, at the end of which the corresponding academic qualification is issued.

PHD PROGRAMMES (*DOTTORATI DI RICERCA*)

The three-year PhD programmes aim at providing students with the necessary knowledge to carry out research activities at universities, public bodies or private institutions. To be admitted in a PhD program one must hold a Master's degree or any other academic qualification obtained abroad and recognized as suitable.

POSTGRADUATE COURSES (MASTERS)

In the Italian university system, "Masters" (not to be confused with Master's degrees) are advanced postgraduate courses which one can attend after obtaining a Bachelor's degree ("first-level Masters") or after a Master's Degree ("second-level "Masters").

POSTGRADUATE SCHOOLS (SCUOLE DI SPECIALIZZAZIONE)

These schools are designed to provide students with the skills and knowledge required for specific professional activities.

SPECIALIZATION COURSES (CORSI DI PERFEZIONAMENTO)

These courses are designed to provide graduates with useful knowledge to update and further their vocational training.



ONLINE STUDENT SERVICES

Online services enable students to carry out many administrative procedures through the Internet, thus avoiding queues at the offices. Particularly important is the user area (area utente). In order to access it, students must enter strictly personal access codes (username and password) assigned at the time of registration. Students can also carry out their registration via SPID, the Digital Identity Public System, which allows to access all the online services of the Public Administration with a single Digital Identity (username and password) that can be used from computers, tablets and smartphones. The most important services of the user area are:

- Registration for evaluative entrance tests and limited access courses
- Enrolment
- Filling of the form *ISEE* (Equivalent Financial Situation Index)
- Drawing of study plans
- Printing of pay-in slips for enrollment fees and university taxes
- Registration for exams

Students having difficulty connecting to the Internet or carrying out the online procedure

can benefit from operators' assistance at the internet point located on the first floor of building C.

ENROLMENT AND REGISTRATION PROCEDURES ENTRANCE TESTS

Degree courses with compulsory evaluative tests

To access all degree courses – except for limited access courses – applicants must take compulsory evaluative tests. These tests have the purpose of evaluating the student's initial knowledge and aptitudes. Should the test results show deficiencies, the managing bodies may organize special remedial classes.

Registration for entrance tests must be carried out from **15 July 2019** up until the deadline established by the managing bodies and notified on the website **www.unisa.it**.

Limited access degree courses with compulsory selective tests

Bachelor's and Master's degree courses with limited access involve compulsory selective tests. The deadline for the submission of test applications, the number of places available, the terms and conditions for the tests as well as registration procedures and deadlines are shown in the single competition notices published in the University Roll (*Albo di Ateneo*) and on the website www.unisa.it Test applications must be submitted exclusively online. Computer stations provided by the University are also available for this procedure. Students are allowed to take one or more entrance tests, compatibly with the test schedule.

ENROLMENT

Enrolment applications for Bachelor's and Master's degree courses with compulsory test must be submitted no later than **8** October 2019.

Applicants will be allowed to enroll only after taking the respective test.

Enrolment applications for limited access Bachelor's and Master's degree courses involving compulsory selective entrance tests must be submitted within the dates shown in the single competition notices (*bandi di concorso*).

A student can enroll in Bachelor's and Master's degree courses involving compulsory selective tests only if ranking

highly enough as established by the single competition notices.

Enrolment applications for the Master's degree courses must be submitted from **15** July 2019 to 2 March 2020.

Enrolment is subject to whether or not the candidate meets the prescribed requirements for each study course. When applying for enrolment, students who do not possess a degree which, as established by the regulations of the individual study course, grants them direct access to the chosen Master's degree course must submit an application for the evaluation of their curricular requirements as well as of their personal knowledge.

Enrolment applications must be submitted exclusively online. Computer stations provided by the University are also available for this procedure.

REGISTRATION FOR SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT YEARS

Registration for second or subsequent years must be carried out from **1 September to 30 September 2019**. Any delay will result in a late payment surtax.

OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES REGISTRATION FOR SINGLE COURSES

Registration for single courses is subject to the approval of the managing department and must be carried out before the beginning of the semester in which the chosen courses will be held, according to the terms and conditions shown in the Student Fee Regulations (*Regolamento in Materia di Contribuzione Studentesca*).

STUDENTS WHO HAVE LOST THEIR MATRICULATED STATUS OR HAVE PREVIOUSLY ABANDONED THEIR STUDIES

Students who have lost their matriculated status or have previously abandoned their studies, if wishing to have an evaluation of their prior undergraduate career to enroll in Bachelor's, Master's degree courses, must submit their career assessment application from 1 July to **19 July 2019**. They must also pay the required fee as indicated in the Student Fee Regulations. These students are exempt from taking evaluative entrance tests, barring a different decision of the single managing bodies. Students who have not submitted their career assessment by 19 July

2019 can still apply for enrollment provided they take the mandatory evaluation test. Credits validation will be made by the managing body after enrolment. Access to Bachelor's and Master's degree courses with limited enrolment is regulated by the single competition notices.

ADDITIONAL DEGREES

Students who already hold a university degree which is not a prerequisite for access and wish to enroll in Bachelor's Master's degree courses must submit their career assessment application from 1 July to 19 July 2019. They must also pay the required fee as indicated in the Student Fee Regulations. These students are exempt from taking evaluative entrance tests, barring a different decision of the single managing bodies. Students who have not submitted their career assessment by 19 July 2019 can still apply for enrollment provided they take the mandatory evaluation test. Credits validation will be made by the managing body after enrolment.

Access to Bachelor's and Master's degree courses with limited enrolment is regulated by the single competition notices.

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CHANGE FROM OLD TO NEW UNIVERSITY SYSTEM

Students enrolled in a study course regulated by a previous university system (*Vecchio Ordinamento*) who wish to change to the corresponding study course regulated by a new system (*Nuovo Ordinamento*) must renew enrolment for the new academic year in the original study course and submit an application from **2 September to 30 September 2019**. These students are exempt from taking evaluative entrance tests, barring a different decision of the single managing bodies.

Access to Bachelor's and Master's degree courses with limited enrolment is regulated by the single competition notices.

CHANGE OF STUDY COURSE

Students enrolled in a particular study course who wish to apply for a transition to a different study course of the same level, within the same or a different study area, must renew enrolment for the new academic year in the original study course from which they wish to request the transition and submit a transition application, accompanied by a career assessment application and a redrawing of the study plan, from **2 September to 30 September 2019**, and pay the contribution provided for in the Student Fee Regulations. These students are exempt from taking evaluative entrance tests, barring a different decision of the single managing bodies.

Students enrolled in a Master's degree course who wish to transfer to another study course of the same level must submit an application for the assessment of curricular requirements and verification of personal knowledge from **1 July to 19 July 2019**, and pay the contribution provided for in the Student Fee Regulations. Students whose request has been accepted by the managing body must renew enrolment for the new condemic way in the activity.

for the new academic year in the original study course and submit the application for change of study course by **30 September 2019**.

Access to Bachelor's and Master's degree courses with limited enrolment is regulated by the single competition notices.

TRANSFER TO OTHER UNIVERSITIES

Students wishing to be transferred from Salerno University to another university must

submit an application from **15 July to 30 September 2019**, or within the deadlines for applications set by other universities and pay the contribution provided for in the Student Fee Regulations.

TRANSFER FROM OTHER UNIVERSITIES

Students wishing to be transferred from another university to Salerno University must submit, from 1 July to 19 July 2019, the application for career or curricular requirements evaluation, verification of personal knowledge and redrawing of the study plan accompanied by a personal sworn declaration of the exams taken, and pay the contribution provided for in the Student Fee Regulations. Students whose application has been accepted by the managing body will have to request the transfer to the university in which they are enrolled, register for the new study course and pay the relative fees and contributions within the deadline for enrolment.

Students who have not submitted the application for career or curricular requirements evaluation, verification of personal knowledge and redrawing of the study plan by 19 July 2019 can still apply for

transfer from another university and enroll in Salerno University, provided they take the mandatory evaluation test. Credits validation will be made by the managing body after enrolment.

Students wishing to transfer to a Master's degree course can also submit the application for career or curricular requirements evaluation, verification of personal knowledge and redrawing of the study plan from **2 January to 20 January 2020**.

For the Master's degree courses, transfer is subject to whether or not the candidate meets the prescribed requirements for the course. Access to Bachelor's and Master's degree courses with limited enrolment is regulated by the single competition notices.

SUBMISSION OF STUDY PLANS

The University of Salerno website has a section for filling in and/or modifying study plans online by accessing the student area. For registered students – whether or not they have completed their courses in the prescribed time – the submission of study plans (when required in the student's guide of the single managing bodies) can be made

exclusively online.

- Students enrolling in a Bachelor's degree course or a single-cycle Master's degree course can submit their study plans within 8 October 2019, or within ten days of the enrolment date, if later than the aforementioned date.
- Students enrolling in a Master's Degree course can submit their study plans within ten days of the enrolment date.
- Students already enrolled can submit their study plans from 5 September to 8 October 2019.

The following is a list of students who must submit their study plans in paper format, or online – according to the decision of the single managing bodies – from **5 September to 8 October 2019**:

- students who have requested to be transferred from another university;
- students who have requested a change of study course or from an old to a new system;
- students wishing to request the inclusion of extra ("off-plan") training activities besides those required to obtain the qualification;
- enrolled students who have applied for a shortened career through the validation of

their previous career;

- students enrolling for a second degree;
- students wishing to change their curriculum.

TAXES AND FEES

For any information on the payment of taxes and fees, see the Student Fee Regulations (*Regolamento in Materia di Contribuzione Studentesca*), which also regulates terms and conditions for part-time registration.

PRE-ENROLMENT PROCEDURES FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS

Foreign students can enroll in Italian universities provided they have obtained a secondary school diploma. Conditions for enrolment are subject to compliance with provisions issued annually by the Ministry of Education, University and Research, available on www.studiare-initalia.it/studentistranieri or on the University of Salarma unabait, assetion Italarnational

Italia.it/studentistranieri or on the University of Salerno website, section International, Iscriversi a UNISA.

EXAMS AND EVALUATION

Each course involves an exam to evaluate the student's progress. Evaluation is given on a



scale of 30 points for standard exams, or with a final proficiency test for all other training activities (internships, apprenticeships, etc.). ECTS credits for each course are acquired on passing the exam or test, regardless of the grade obtained.

FINAL GRADUATION EXAM

To be admitted to the final graduation exam, students must have earned all the ECTS credits required by the regulations of the single degree course, which also regulate the contents, characteristics and manner of conduction and evaluation of the test.

TEACHING CALENDAR

The normal period for lectures, seminars, training, laboratory and integrated activities is set between 1 October 2019 and 30 June 2020. Christmas holidays: 23 December 2019 - 6 January 2020 Summer holidays: 3 August - 31 August 2020 Patron Saint's day: 21 September

PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

During the course of study, students must provide their personal data to the University for administration purposes. The University of Salerno conforms the processing of personal data to the provisions of Legislative Decree 196/2003, which regulates the protection of personal data, ensuring that the processing takes place in compliance with the rights, fundamental freedoms, dignity and confidentiality of natural persons, and (EU) Regulation 2016/679.

DEPARTMENTAL CAREER OFFICES (UFFICI CARRIERE) AND TEACHING OFFICES (UFFICI DIDATTICA)

Career offices are in charge of managing student careers (enrolment, registration, exam validation, certificates, transfers, change of study course, abandonment, etc). Teaching offices, which have been merged with the Career Offices, are in charge of all educational and teaching aspects (course calendar, teaching times, study plans, exam sessions, exam registration, mentoring, etc.). OFFICE FOR THE RIGHT TO UNIVERSITY STUDY. SCHOLARSHIPS, REDUCED FARES

The Office supervises the distribution and management of services facilitating access, attendance, study continuity and full integration into Campus life, particularly for deserving students with limited financial means, and disabled people.

The Office has competence over the following services:

- scholarships
- student part-time collaborations (150 hours)
- reduced rates for food service
- reduced rates for housing service
- services for students with disabilities
- scholarship supplements for international mobility programmes
- scholarship supplements for graduate students (*Premio di Laurea*)
- contributions to student initiatives and student societies
- daycare center
- counselling

UNISA rewards merit

As of July 2015, the University of Salerno

promotes the "Policy of Merit", aimed at financially supporting students and their families. The University's tax policy rewards students who complete their study course on time, regardless of their family income bracket and provided they have submitted their ISEE form, by paying a contribution equal to the fees they have previously paid.

Scholarships

(in conjunction with ADISURC - *Azienda Regionale per il Diritto allo Studio Universitario della Regione Campania*) A few thousand students can benefit from yearly contributions ranging from 2,000 to 5,000 euros. Scholarships are assigned by means of a competition held on an annual basis. The notice is posted in (approximately) mid-July on the university website (www.unisa.it) and the ADISURC website **www.adisurcampania.it**, in the former ADISU Salerno section.

The competition is open to all students enrolled or planning to enroll in Salerno University courses (including doctoral courses, research and specialization courses) who meet the prescribed financial and merit requirements.

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Student part-time collaborations

Every year, around five hundred students can carry out paid part-time collaborations of 150 hours with the University's teaching bodies and administrative offices. The contribution (about 1,000 euros) is assigned by means of a competition held on an annual basis and posted on the Salerno University website.

Reduced rates for food service: cafeterias and refreshment points

(in conjunction with ADISURC - Azienda Regionale per il Diritto allo Studio Universitario della Regione Campania) All scholarship assignees and eligible nonassignees are given a card to benefit from reduced food rates – in variable measure, depending on the student's family income bracket – at the ADISURC cafeteria located on the Fisciano and Baronissi campuses.

Reduced rates for housing service

(in conjuction with ADISURC - Azienda Regionale per il Diritto allo Studio Universitario della Regione Campania) Scholarship assignees residing outside the metropolitan area of Salerno can enjoy reduced rates for the university residence halls located on the Fisciano and Baronissi campuses. Other students wishing to live on campus can apply for the housing service (allotment is subject to room availability). Regulations can be found at www.adisurcampania.it.

Scholarship supplements for international mobility programmes

(in conjunction with ADISURC - Azienda Regionale per il Diritto allo Studio Universitario della Regione Campania) Students who are winners of, or eligible to, the competition for a scholarship, are granted a supplementary contribution for participating in international mobility programs promoted by EU and extra-European institutions. Benefits are assigned according to the rules and timing established by the single competition notices.

Scholarship supplements for graduate students

(in conjunction with ADISURC - *Azienda Regionale per il Diritto allo Studio Universitario della Regione Campania*) The *Premio di Laurea* or "graduation prize" consists in assigning the student a sum of money equal to 50% of the last scholarship granted. The prize can be requested by scholarship assignees who have graduated within the prescribed time. Prizes are assigned through the terms and conditions established by the single competition notices.





UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES, CENTRES AND FACILITIES



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LIBRARIES

The University Library Centre is organized into two main libraries one for the Humanities and the other for Science and Technology, both located on the Fisciano campus. A third library, serving the Department of Medicine, Surgery and Dentistry "Scuola Medica Salernitana". is located on the Baronissi campus. The relationship between the University Library Centre and its users is defined by a purposely shaped set of rules and a service card (carta dei servizi) which ensure the staff's commitment to meeting the informative needs of the whole academic community. In addition to computerized book lending on campus. the Centre features interlibrary lending and document delivery services for the consultation of books and documents. from other libraries having exchange agreements with the University of Salerno. The reference service (also accessible via Skype) provides information and advice on the use of the library, its catalogue, its paper and electronic resources. The documentation centre provides assistance in specialized bibliographical research. They are both online and accessible by connecting to the Portal.

The training service, organized into user groups, is designed to communicate, circulate and valorize document research skills, resources, services and strategies. The full catalogue, entirely computerized with *Alma Ex Libris*, consists of 465,000 bibliographic records. It can be consulted via the web, from self-service computer stations located in the catalogue room, and mobile systems (smart phones, palmtops, etc.). The University Library Portal www.biblioteche.unisa.it grants access to document resources and services, and features additional bibliographic research tools.

The Centre subscribes to a large number of databases related to various fields of study, and grants access to over 12,000 online journals, most of which are "full-text" and remotely accessible.

University Library Centre – "E. R. Caianiello" Library

Built in the 1990s after the designs of Massimo Pica Ciamarra and dedicated to physician Eduardo Renato Caianiello (1921-1993), the main library of the Fisciano campus features book collections pertaining to the humanities, law and economics. It has more than 600 study desks – 40 of which can be reserved online - spread over eighteen consultation rooms. These are all organized according to the "open-shelf" system, which grants the user direct access to books. The library has approximately 590,000 bibliographical items and over 4,700 paper journals (1,700 of which are still being published). A multimedia room equipped with 12 workstations is open to the public.

University Library Centre - Science and Technology Library

Designed by Nicola Pagliara and opened in May 2013, this new facility has a total capacity of approximately 350,000 bibliographical units and features collections formerly belonging to the libraries of the Faculties of Mathematical, Physical and Natural Sciences, Engineering and Pharmacy. There are ca 1.500 paper journals, of which little less than 400 are still being published. The entire corpus is covered by a single catalogue powered by Alma, and is set according to the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC). User workstations are 540 (of which 150 can be reserved online) spread over 7 large consultation rooms. A loan service of laptops is also available

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UNIVERSITY CENTRE FOR ORIENTATION AND MENTORING (CAOT)

The University Centre for Orientation and Mentoring (*Centro di Ateneo per* l'Orientamento e Tutorato – CAOT) www.orientamento.unisa.it, which is part of the Office for the Right to University Study, has multiple objectives. These include: fostering well-thought out choices for students' university careers; offering practical mentoring and support; facilitating the entry of graduates into the world of work. In order to ensure continuity between school and university, fruitful relationships have been established with about 300 secondary schools from the University's catchment area. Located in the *Rettorato* building (A1), the CAOT supervises many initiatives and provides useful services to students, as listed below

UnisaOrienta

The UnisaOrienta initiative is organized on an annual basis in collaboration with the university's departments. The event consists of seminars held by university teachers for the presentation of learning objectives and employment opportunities. It also enables a

large number of students to form a comprehensive picture of the educational opportunities provided by the university. The event includes seminars and debates. between school and university aimed at consolidating the relationship between the two worlds. Such seminars have been attended by high school and university teachers, directors of teaching boards, department heads and orientation delegates. In 2019 the event reached its 15th edition and was held in the days between 1 and 15 February with two afternoons sessions. The event has gathered approximately 18,000 students and 800 high school teachers from the university's catchment area.

Offsite Orientation

The Centre participates in important events organized by external public bodies and high schools from the university's catchment area.

Future freshers on Campus: a guided tour through the university's sites and resources

Organized in collaboration with the orientation delegates from the different







study courses and the University's offices and services, this initiative enables high school students and teachers to take a guided tour through the sites and resources of the Fisciano campus. The event takes place upon reservation on Fridays from November to May.

In the academic year 2018-2019, 30 high schools were involved in the initiative, with a total of approximately 1,400 students and 90 accompanying teachers.

Information desk

The Information Desk provides reception and assistance services for enrolling, enrolled and leaving students all year round. The desk also provides information via telephone or email and hands out the University Guide. The CAOT is open Monday to Thursday from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm.

Online self-evaluation test

The self-evaluation test for aptitudes, motivation and personal skills is available on the website **orientamento.unisa.it/home/iniziativeattivita?id=174**. The test is designed to give enrolling students useful self-evaluation tools for well thought-out career choices.

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Work-related high school learning (*Alternanza Scuola-Lavoro*)

The University of Salerno promotes courses within the *Alternanza Scuola-Lavoro* project, guaranteeing the scientific rigour of programmes and contributing to strengthening the bond between school, university, the local community and the world of work. The Salerno University website has a dedicated *Alternanza Scuola-Lavoro* portal where it is possible to find information and materials, both of a general nature and related to the projects of the single departments.

Orientation materials

The CAOT manages the drawing and printing of various paper and multimedia information material, including the University Guide, which is issued on an annual basis. The Guide, enriched and supplemented by multimedia contents (downloadable with a special app), presents the University's programmes, services, teaching and research facilities, as well as cultural and sporting activities, thus advertizing the whole of resources that the University has to offer. Printed in 25,000 copies and translated into English, Spanish and Chinese, the Guide is distributed during the orientation and cultural events organized by the University. The Guide is available online at

experience/guidaateneo. In 2018, the centre supervised the drawing and publication of a report titled *L'orientamento Unisa. Progetti e iniziative*, which offers a complete picture of all the initiatives for orientation and work-related learning supervised by the CAOT and the university departments.

PLACEMENT SERVICE

The Placement Service acts as a meeting point between the University and the world of work, thus providing students and graduates with better opportunities to find employment. To achieve this goal, the Placement Service periodically organizes meetings and workshops with various companies to make the transition from university to work more effective. By resorting to the AlmaLaurea database, the service provides undergraduate and graduate students with tools and materials to find their way and enhance their knowledge of the world of work. This helps students to seek internships and job opportunities in Italy and abroad. One of the aspects in which the university particularly intends to invest is that of curricular internships, which represent the students' first steps into the world of work and are financially supported by the Ministry of Education, University and Research (MIUR). The most relevant activities of the Office include:

- updated online bulletin board for internships and jobs;
- Help Find Job (HFJ) service: individual interviews for career orientation;
- support for CV drafting and updating;
- support for developing databases of companies and organizations interested in participating in active work policies (internships, apprenticeships, etc.);
- organization of monthly "Job Days", for companies to meet young promising students;

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- organization of "Job in Campus", an annual event dedicated to the entry of graduate students into the world of work, as well as an opportunity for companies to share their needs for expertise and human resources;
- collaboration in the organization of events and projects for recruiting and training near-graduates, newly graduates, PhD students, PhD holders and research fellows (ANPAL, Bank of Italy, Constitutional Court of Italy)

INTERUNIVERSITY CONSORTIUM "ALMALAUREA"

As of academic year 2003-2004, the University of Salerno is part of the interuniversity consortium *AlmaLaurea*, made up of 74 Italian universities. AlmaLaurea provides an innovative service consisting in a database which posts graduates' CVs online. This contributes to creating relations between the university and businesses, facilitates young people's entry into the world of work (nationally and abroad), and reduces the time gap between demand and supply of skilled work. In order to be listed in the *AlmaLaurea* database, graduating students must fill in a special form with their school and university CV before graduation.

Graduates can modify their AlmaLaurea CVs in real time, thus keeping their professional profiles always up to date. Furthermore, they can get relevant information about internships, apprenticeships, postgraduate courses and job offers. About 1,900,000 Italian graduates (77% of the total) enter their CVs in the Almal aurea database, which is resorted to by a large number of companies (about 16.000). The Consortium also issues the annual "Graduate Profile Report" and the "Survey on the Graduates' Employment Status" after 1, 3 and 5 years of graduation. The AlmaLaurea website also features AlmaOrientati, an orientation programme designed for high-school graduates, which generates an individual orientation profile, providing each student with advice on the educational or professional plan which is closest to their personal aspirations.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS - ERASMUS OFFICE

The University of Salerno promotes internationalization by establishing Erasmus+ and other international cooperation agreements with European and extra-European institutions, as well as traineeship agreements with companies, institutions and research centres. As part of said agreements, the University encourages mobility programmes for students, teachers and administrative staff. It promotes joint research and teaching activities, and fosters initiatives for the issuance of double qualifications.

Erasmus+ program

Erasmus+ is an EU program, active for the period 2014-2020 in the fields of education, training, youth and sports. It involves three key actions involving different sectors:

- Individual mobility for learning purposes (Key Action 1);
- Cooperation for innovation and exchange of good practices (Key Action 2);
- Support of policy reforms (Key Action 3). Key action 1 (Individual mobility for learning



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purposes) allows mobility of students and staff. The latter can apply for teaching activities and staff training. Students can take a period of mobility for study and/or traineeship up to a maximum of 12 months for each study cycle. Singlecycle Master's degree programs include a mobility time of 24 months in total, which can be taken in more than one period.

Mobility for studying

Enables students to carry out part of their study programme at a foreign institution with an Erasmus+ agreement for a minimum of 3 months and a maximum of 12. Before leaving, students must stipulate a study plan to be completed abroad. If successfully carried out, this plan will be validated upon return.

Mobility for Traineeships

Enables students to take time for an internship abroad for a minimum of 2 months and a maximum of 12. Mobility for Traineeships can be taken during the course of study or within 12 months of graduation. Before leaving, students must stipulate a traineeship plan to be completed abroad. This plan may be validated upon return.

International Credit Mobility programs

The Erasmus+ program may involve mobility projects for students and staff, from and to other countries.

Cooperation agreements for the issuance of double qualifications

These agreements enable students to carry out part of their study programme at a partner university and obtain a double qualification, one issued by the University of Salerno and the other by the host institution.

UNISA Scholarship Programme

This is a scholarship programme for international students who enroll in Master's degree courses. The scholarship includes board and lodging at the university residences and cafeteria, as well as an Italian language course at the University Language Centre (CLA).

Visiting professor programme

As part of the above mentioned programme, the University of Salerno annually selects foreign or Italian scholars of high scientific

profile belonging to non-Italian universities, research centres, and/or higher education institutions. The aim is to foster the international character of teaching and research at the University of Salerno. 15

UNIVERSITY LANGUAGE CENTRE (CENTRO LINGUISTICO DI ATENEO -CLA)

The University Language Centre (CLA) is a language and audiovisual service centre which promotes the learning of European languages with integrative, practical, communicational and instrumental purposes, also fostering the study of LSPs (Languages for Specific Purposes). CLA activities are meant for all students i.e. undergraduates, postgraduates, PhD students, Postgraduate School students, Specialization Course students, Erasmus and Socrates students, as well as the teaching, research and administrative staff. The centre encourages plurilingualism and interculturality through higher education courses exploring orientation, self-study, distance learning, continuing permanent education. By means of technologically advanced equipment and state of the art



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teaching material, the CLA promotes translation and interpreting services, research and experimentation in the fields of language, evaluation and methodology.

Services provided

In compliance with the European provisions on education and language learning and with the aim of contributing to the enhancement of the university's teaching offer, the CLA provides:

- foreign language teaching support, including Italian as a second language for foreign students;
- rooms equipped with language learning tools including books, magazines, and audiovisual material;
- latest language learning technologies (including distance education);
- taught courses and other language services, including self-study of languages, in collaboration with the university's departments;
- assessments on the language skills required to access study courses, as well as on assigning additional credits;
- research activities both in the field of theoretical reflection on foreign language

learning/acquisition and in the applicative and experimental area of language teaching and language technology;

- technical activities of consultancy, training, updating and professional qualification for public or private entities (in compliance with institutional priorities and agreements);
- seminars, meetings and international study days on new teaching methods and computer-mediated linguistic interaction activities.

Infopoint

The Centre's Infopoint provides support for all students at UNISA, including undergraduates, postgraduates, PhD students, Postgraduate School students, Specialization Course students, Erasmus and Socrates students, as well as the teaching, research and administrative stafflt releases information on course timetables as well as on enrolment and attendance procedures for the self-learning lab, multimedia lab, thesiswriters' lab. CLA cards can be collected at the Infopoint, open Monday to Friday from 8:30 am to 5:30 pm.

Foreign language courses

The University Language Centre manages courses of English, French, Spanish, German, Russian, and Italian for foreign students, all taught by teachers or language experts. Courses are divided into yearly and half-yearly cycles (scheduled dates are officially notified on departmental and CLA bulletin boards at the beginning of each academic year).

Teaching activities

CLA courses aim at developing the four abilities of listening, reading, speaking and writing. Students are divided into homogeneous groups based on entry tests taken at the beginning of the academic year. Generally, the levels are those set out by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, as listed below:

- 0 Beginner
- -1 Elementary
- 2 Lower Intermediate
- 3 Upper Intermediate
- 4 Advanced
- 5 Very Advanced.

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Multimedia labs

The CLA features 16 multimedia language labs equipped with computers, printers, scanners, DVD burners, satellite TV, digital video projector, electronic board and "Sanako" language learning software. Students use the labs in groups, supervised by a mother-tongue teacher or language expert. The CLA also has an Experimentation Lab, aimed at the preparation of innovative materials for language teaching.

Self-study lab

In order to grant the students a more effective study effort and taking into account the single learning methods and specific thematic areas, the CLA provides self-study materials which users can access under the supervision of a tutor, so as to valorize students' aptitudes, interests and individual learning paces. Self-study labs can be used in complete autonomy to effectively integrate the contents of regular courses. Access to workstations is open to all students who hold the CLA card released at the Infopoint. The lab is open Mondays to Thursdays from 9:00am to 5:30pm, and Fridays from 9:00am to 2:00pm.

Thesis-writers' lab

The CLA features a lab for thesis-writers equipped with Internet connection and other useful tools for bibliographic research and documents for writing a traditional, experimental or multimedia dissertation. Access to workstations is open to all students who hold a CLA card. The lab is also available for Erasmus students willing to stay in touch with their home universities, families and friends.

International Certifications

As of 15 December 2008, the University Language Centre is an official Cambridge English Language Assessment Authorized Centre for English language international certifications. The exams take place at the Language Centre in the presence of mothertongue teachers certified by the Cambridge English Language Assessment – part of the University of Cambridge. The Language Centre administers the following exams: Cambridge English: KEY (KET) – corresponding to the A2 level of the CEFR Cambridge English: PRELIMINARY (PET) – corresponding to the B1 level of the CEFR Cambridge English: FIRST (FCE) – corresponding to the B2 level of the CEFR Cambridge English: ADVANCED (CAE) – corresponding to the C1 level of the CEFR Cambridge English: PROFICIENCY (CPE) – corresponding to the C2 level of the CEFR The CLA is in the top 3 language centres nationwide and first in Campania by number of exams taken. Italian language certifications Certificate of knowledge of the Italian language (CELI)

The CLA is home to a CELI Examination Center and gives the opportunity to all foreign students enrolled in UNISA, those who have attended L2 Italian courses (Erasmus and non-Erasmus students) and foreign citizens to obtain the Italian language certificate issued by the University for Foreigners Perugia and recognized by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, as in compliance with the European standards of the ALTE (Association of Language Testers in







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Europe) and the CEF (Common European Framework) of the Council of Europe.

Teaching Italian as a foreign language certification (DILS)

As part of an agreement with the University for Foreigners Perugia, the CLA proposes a level I certification in "Teaching Italian as a Foreign Language" (DILS). The DILS certification attests a level I pedagogicaldidactic competence, which is crucial for entering the profession and / or for the evaluation of the service provided.

Certification of Competence in Teaching Italian as a Foreign Language (DITALS)

As part of an agreement with the DITALS centre of the University for Foreigners of Siena, the CLA proposes a certification of competence in teaching Italian as a foreign language. The DITALS certification attests 3 levels of competence in teaching Italian as a foreign language, in compliance with the project EPG – European Profiling Grid www.epg-project.eu/. The 3 levels include the Basic DITALS Certification, the Level I DITALS Certification and the Level II DITALS Certification. It is possible to directly access the Level I and Level II DITALS Certifications without having obtained the DITALS Certifications of the previous levels.

E-Learning

Acknowledging the importance of e-learning and multimedia, in order to support the educational and ever-changing needs of attending and working students, the CLA features:

- laboratories equipped for distance learning through language exercises and online checks, multimedia CDs, teletutoring, chat lines, tutor/students interaction;
- multi-functional e-books to support frontal teaching and for the synchronic use of study stations and diachronic self-study;
- diversified accesses for contextualization paths and personalization of the training programme;
- traditional and multimedia contents integrated with computerized services which facilitate interaction between students, language experts and tutors.

Work-related high school learning (*Alternanza Scuola-Lavoro*)

In order to provide an educational offer that combines knowledge and know-how, the CLA supports high schools in orienting the future choices of young people through new and more dynamic learning formats which will complete their training through the acquisition of language skills that can be best spent in the labor market.

Translation services (language support and translations)

The CLA offers proofreading, supervision and translation services for texts from and to all European languages. The centre also provides simultaneous and consecutive interpretation services entrusted to mothertongue language experts with proven experience in the field.

OGEPO

The interdepartmental Observatory for Gender Studies and Equal Opportunities (OGEPO), which revolves around 11 departments, has among its main objectives:

• promoting research and comparison on gender studies and statistics, equality and

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equal opportunities;

- promoting and sponsoring courses and cultural initiatives to raise awareness about all forms of direct and indirect discrimination at work and study environments;
- raising awareness for the social players in the local community about equal opportunities, while fostering dialogue between genders and generations;
- performing tutoring and mentoring activities in the fields of teaching and education in order to foster the culture of non-discimination.

The OGEPO is currently (2018-2022) the leading supervisor of the European project "Pilot Experiences for Improving Gender Equality in Research Organizations (R & I Peers)", having won the Horizon 2020 -SwafS-2017 call. In this respect, OGEPO has promoted the creation of a Gender Equality Plan (GEP).

ICT CENTRE FOR CULTURAL HERITAGE

The ICT Centre for Cultural Heritage was designed to guarantee the University of Salerno a primary role in the innovative use of Cultural Heritage and Creative Industry technology. In particular, the Centre is intended to be a reference point for the University and the local community for the promotion of ICT and web technologies for the protection, valorization and sustainable use of Cultural Heritage. The Centre collaborates with public and private institutions from Italy and abroad. The Center is responsible for:

- research and development of innovative technologies and best practices for the conservation, valorization and sustainable development of Cultural Heritage in a socio-economic perspective;
- technology transfer, management and circulation of innovation, particularly in the field of Cultural Heritage;
- scientific initiatives conducted at the University of Salerno or other universities and/or other public and private research centres;
- participation in national and international research projects and programs. Further information is available at the

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COUNSELING CENTRE

The "Michele Cesaro" counseling centre has the following objectives:

providing professional help to students experiencing personal difficulties that might hinder the achievement of their academic goals;

listening to and providing support for students with interpersonal relationship difficulties and social integration problems (due, for example, to disability and/or sociocultural disadvantage), in order to improve self-awareness and interpersonal communication skills;

helping students in stressful situations to identify the source of their unease and develop adaptation strategies; providing support and counseling in situations of stress and anxiety; supporting students experiencing problems with a study course that does not really fit their interests and motivations, in order to possibly reformulate their choices and objectives;

providing methodological support to stimulate the student's ability to find a personal study method to better process course contents; fostering integration of disabilities. - diagnosis;

- research;
- monitoring;

SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES OR SPECIFIC LEARNING DISORDERS (SLD)

The University of Salerno offers specialized

services to provide students with disabilities with equal educational opportunities, full integration, actual participation and selfreliance.

In particular, the service includes:

- reception;
- assistance for administrative procedures;
- preparation of auxiliary teaching aids for those with no access to traditional paper materials;
- implementation of dedicated computer aids and equipment;
- special tutoring within the departments;
- orientation for enrolling, enrolled, and leaving students;
- posting of ad hoc notices and funding for international mobility;
- support for students with dyslexia or other SLDs ;
- recreation and social integration;
- counseling;
- support for transportation within the Campus area;
- assistance with test completion (entrance tests, admission tests for postgraduate courses, curricular exams);
- assessing and monitoring accessibility to campus facilities;



ADISURC

ADISURC (*Azienda per il Diritto allo Studio Universitario della Regione Campania* -Campania's Authority for the Right to University Study) has the statutory purpose of guaranteeing all students access to the highest levels of education, by providing accommodation, support and services such as catering and housing, as well as scholarships and grants for students who meet the prescribed income and merit requirements.

RESIDENCE HALLS

As of 2009, the Fisciano campus is equipped with highly efficient residence halls for students and faculty. An important result in terms of urban and social planning, the Fisciano residences count 780 beds. They are made up of one- or two-room flats and ready-furnished mini apartments, all equipped with air conditioning, kitchenette, telephone, internet connection, satellite TV input. Accommodation comprises additional services such as reception rooms, study rooms, meeting rooms, a breakfast room, lounges, automatic laundries, cafés, a projection room, a gym.

Most of the one-room flats are reserved for *fuori sede* students (i.e. students residing outside the metropolitan area of Salerno) who have been awarded accommodation. Occupancy lasts at least 10 months. Mini-apartments and one-room flats which are not reserved for *fuori sede* students are given to other guests for a fee according to ADISURC regulations.

Some housing units are specially equipped for students with disabilities; others are intended for foreign students and teachers for the purpose of fostering internationalization.

Another residence complex was built in Sava (Baronissi) with former ADISU Salerno funds. It has three floors and hosts 86 beds, 10 of which are reserved for people with disabilities.

The whole of residence halls run by ADISURC also includes the recovery and restoration of *Palazzo Barra* in Lancusi (Fisciano), approximately 1 km away from the Baronissi

campus. The building has 21 mini apartments for a total of 24 beds, 2 of which are reserved for disabled people. Regulations can be found at www.adisurcampania.it, in the section of former ADISU Salerno.

CAFETERIAS

The catering service, managed by ADISURC, is one of the flagships of Salerno University. The main facility has approximately 1300 seats and is located at the Fisciano campus. It is open Monday to Friday from 12.00pm to 3.00pm, and from 7:00pm to 9:00pm. The two ample dining rooms ensure a cutting-edge service in terms of organization and innovation.

Students pay according to their family income bracket and may supplement or change their meals with extra items and various drinks. The cafeteria also provides pizza and packed meals.

During the summer months, stands selling homemade ice cream are also available. Daily menus are promptly posted on the ADISURC website.

Furthermore, a catering service for celiac people was launched in collaboration with "Associazione Italiana Celiaci Onlus

Campania".

The second facility, located at the Baronissi campus, is open Monday to Friday from 12:00pm 3:00pm. For students of Medicine and Surgery, Dentistry and Prosthodontics, and Health Professions, a catering service is provided at the canteen of the University Hospital "OO.RR.S. Giovanni di Dio e RuggiD'Aragona" in Salerno.

UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION

The University Foundation is an instrumental body set up to efficiently manage services and support teaching and research activities. It provides the university with a number of services, including: cleaning services, management and maintenance of green areas, catering, six refreshment points with hot meals, vending machines supplying drinks and snacks, collection and disposal of WEEE (Waste of Electric and Electronic Equipment), design and production of printing products and multimedia support, technical-logistical support for the university's educational activities, management of the insurance portfolio, management of the university's daycare

centre. Ideally conceived to interact with the different cultural and economic entities of the local area, the Foundation plays an active role in establishing development agreements with regional bodies and industries linked to the university, also promoting recruiting activities in collaboration with the university Placement Service. The Foundation also holds a certified quality management system as well as a technical certification for cleaning services and maintenance of green areas.

The Foundation is accredited with Regione Campania for the provision of education, training and job services. The Foundation is an opportunity accelerator for research, development and technology transfer as it participates in university spin-offs and startups (e.g. Genomix4Life srl and BioUniversa srl). UNIVERSITY COPY CENTRE

The University Copy Centre (*Centro Stampa di Ateneo*) provides low-cost printing and communication services for the university community. The centre deals with the design and creation of printed products and

communication projects with the aid of photography tools, high-quality and highresolution videos. UAVs of different makes for different needs. It creates editorial and creative graphics, prints in different formats and multimedia contents, photo and video shootings (including post-production). The new aerial photography unit allows the university to enjoy a technical UAV service for aerial photogrammetry at a low cost. The Copy Centre has two branches, one located on the ground floor of the main administration building (Rettorato), the other in Piazza del Sapere. The first branch is devoted to production and features professional equipment for high-quality, inkjet, impact, digital printings and bindings. The second branch provides a variety of services, including the printing of projects and dissertations, as well as support for the organization of events, and a wide range of technical stationery. The second branch also hosts the service of photo and video multimedia content creation and UAV service. Both branches are open Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 5.30pm. Telephone: +39 089 969169

OBSERVATORY OF THE SOUTHERN APPENNINES

The consortium "Osservatorio dell'Appennino Meridionale", founded in 1999 by the University of Salerno and Regione Campania, is based at the Fisciano campus. Its prime objective is the valorization of Southern Apennines locations through the promotion and development of research activities in numerous fields. The Consortium is also involved in many activities, including:

- special maintenance of the arboretum (recovery of spoiled areas, new facilities, preparation of educational programs, etc.);
- maintenance and management of the greenhouse located within the arboretum;
- enlargement of the Observatory's documentation museum/centre through the implementation of data and results of conducted activities;
- carrying out training and congress activities for identifying new projects and circulating those accomplished.

CLUB HOUSE

The Club House building is located at the entrance of the Fisciano campus, facing the



main street. The facility is meant as a place of social aggregation for the whole university community and the general public. The idea of a Club House, envisioned by Michelinstarred chef Raffaele Vitale, includes a restaurant, an area for tasting and buying typical products, and a coffee house. The service is open from morning until evening hours, including weekends. The aim of the project is to boost campus life, using the Club House as a recreational and educational facility revolving around the world of food and wine.

GENERAL MEDICAL CENTRE

Located in building M2 on Viale Galileo Galilei, the centre provides first-aid care and possible free specialist visits for students as part of the regional screening. Rescue and emergency transportation service is available Monday to Friday. For further information and reservations: tel. 089 969272.

DAYCARE CENTRE

Located in the town Fisciano, the asilo nido aziendale "Roberto Mazzetti" is the second university daycare centre ever implemented in Italy. It is intended for the children of the students and employees of Salerno University and, in a fixed percentage, for the children of Fisciano residents and those of the neighboring towns. The nursery can host 60 children from 3 months to 3 years old, and features:

- high-quality and eco-friendly facilities;
- high-quality service, guaranteed by university staff providing guidance, supervision and monitoring;

STUDY ROOMS

Students have access to numerous study rooms, some of which are equipped with computers. Ten study rooms at the Fisciano campus are also open on weekends.

INTERNET POINT

Located on the first floor of building C, facing the INFO DESK of the former faculty of Economics, the Internet Point features computer stations equipped with scanners, to connect with online student services. Being exclusively an IT support service, all information on teaching and administrative procedures, will be found at the offices of the students' departments.

Opening times: Monday to Friday 9:00am - 13:00pm.

GREAT HALL (AULA MAGNA)

Dedicated to prof. Vincenzo Buonocore, the Great Hall (*Aula Magna*) is provided with multimedia equipment, and has 700 seats available. It hosts happenings and academic events. It is located inside building A2.

THEATRE

Located in the same building as the Great Hall, the University Theatre was designed by the renowned Neapolitan architect and designer Filippo Alison, to whom the facility has been recently entitled. Conceived as a multifunctional facility, the F. Alison theatre has a capacity of approximately 300 seats, a fully equipped stage, a foyer, and dressing rooms for artists.

POST OFFICE - BANK

The campus features a bank (building M3) and a post office (building M2), both on Viale





Galileo Galilei.

POLICE STATION

A police station is situated at the Fisciano Campus on Viale Galileo Galilei (building M3). The office manages the following matters: issuance and renewal of passports, filing reports and complaints, campus protection and prevention.

CHAPEL

Dedicated to St. Gregory VII, the chapel is located on the ground floor of building D3, on Viale della Conoscenza at the Fisciano campus. It has approximately 100 seats.

GREEN AREAS

The campus features several gardens, large green areas with benches, and a 14,000 square-metre thematic arboretum.

REFRESHMENT POINTS

The campus hosts several cafés acting as refreshment and meeting points.

PARKING

The University has free car parks. The Fisciano campus features 3853 parking

spaces, whereas Baronissi has 477. In addition to these, both campuses show courtesy maternity parking spots, appropriately marked by vertical and horizontal signs: 20 spaces are on the Fisciano campus, 6 are in Baronissi.

BUS TERMINAL - UNIVERSITY SHUTTLE

The bus terminal is equipped with twelve stalls divided by routes and geographical areas of destination/origin of the carriers. Each of the stalls is identified by a colour and is covered by a metal platform roof. The Baronissi campus has been equipped with a new bus terminal and a new entrance roundabout. To facilitate mobility within the Fisciano campus and to connect the two University campuses, a free shuttle service is available.

HELIPORT

Located inside the Fisciano campus, the heliport is an area designed for the take-off and landing of helicopters. It is equipped with facilities for water recovery and supply for aircraft operating in the neighbouring areas. During the summer, the heliport hosts the regional fire service.

CONNECTIONS TO CAMPUS

The local bus service provides regular connections between the University of Salerno and the the towns of the neighbouring area. Different bus lines will depart and arrive at the bus terminal of the Fisciano campus, which is equipped with a comfortable waiting room. A shuttle service connects the Fisciano and the Baronissi campuses every 30 minutes. The service is free for students. Furthermore, connection services are available to and from neighbouring regions and long-distance connections.

Students from Campania may benefit from reduced fares as established by Regione Campania.

THEATRE ACTIVITIES

The university theatre was started in 2005 and has since hosted theatre seasons, music events, workshops, exhibitions, meetings and lecture-shows which have contributed to make the students' training richer and more varied. It has also promoted fruitful forms of interdisciplinarity and experimentation for research and teaching.

The theatre plays a crucial role through UnisArt, a point of convergence where the various visual languages (cinema, art, theatre, new media) meet with new technologies, economics, law and territorial studies. This enables the university to develop new forms of knowledge and innovative job profiles.

On such a basis, collaborations and exchanges are promoted with organizations, institutions and foundations since the theatre, besides following its own objectives, works in two directions: conducting international and advanced research; giving voice to experimentation, with special attention paid to young Campania-based theatre companies whose work is particularly significant and innovative. Together with the Salerno City Council and



the "Assoli" Association, the University is a founding partner of the "Fondazione Salerno Contemporanea – Teatro d'Innovazione" whose purpose is to promote research and experimentation in the fields of arts and entertainment.

UNISOUND

As the official radio of the University of Salerno, Unisound aims at promoting radio as an educational and cultural medium. particularly through the mastering of webradio techniques, cognitive dynamics and the language of journalism. Unisound is a laboratorial tool designed for collective, community usage which interacts with each branch and professional figure of the University, and is chiefly oriented to students, who represent the main target audience. As part of this project, it is possible to carry out traineeships and supplementary courses to communication activities in the following areas: music and news programming, audio-video recording of conferences, seminars, events, workshops and lectures taking place at the university. The radio headquarters are located at the ground floor of the *Rettorato* building. To

All facilities can be used by the University's students, teachers, technical-administrative staff and are open to the general public.



The Fisciano campus features:

- one indoor swimming pool;
- one indoor tennis court with artificial turf;
- one multi-purpose court with artificial turf for tennis and five-a-side football;
- three five-a-side football pitches with artificial turf;
- one tennis court with artificial turf;
- one free-climbing wall;
- one fitness room located inside the residence halls;
- a bicycle lane which can also be used for jogging (during opening hours, bicycles are provided by CUS).

The Baronissi campus features:

• A sports hall (PalaUnisa A, a 1200 squaremeter multipurpose gym) for basketball,

THE UNIVERSITY OF SALERNO FOR UNIVERSIADE 2019

The University of Salerno was a protagonist of the 2019 Universiade. From 3 to 14 July. the Baronissi campus turned into an actual sports village, hosting around 2,000 athletes from 128 countries around the world. On this occasion, UNISA chose to host the fencing competition, as this sport has always enjoyed great popularity in the Salerno area. In recognizing the nature, scope and significance of the event, the university has co-financed an outstanding programme for the construction, recovery and expansion of the sports facilities run by CUS Salerno. The project included: the modernization and upgrading of the "PalaUnisa A" sports hall; the construction of two new buildings, the "PalaUnisa B" and the "PalaUnisa C": the modernization of the "Pilotis" gym and the

construction of the new Bus Terminal on the Baronissi campus, with the overall reconfiguration of the road network. On the Fisciano campus, on the other hand, the Athletes' Village was set up near the university residences in the Mariscoli area. For twelve days, the ADISURC-run residential compound was animated by athletes, staff and managers who were able to share and get to know the spaces, facilities and, above all, the community spirit of the University of Salerno Also in Fisciano and Mercato San Severino, the training sessions of the soccer event were hosted, respectively at the new "Unisa Stadium" and the "Superga" sports field. Defined as an expedited and intense "Erasmus of Sport", the event saw the university best express the values of hospitality, friendliness and welcoming. which have always characterized campus life. With the coordination of delegates Luciano Feo (Organization Manager of "Universiade 2019 for the University of Salerno") and Nicola Maffulli (Manager of the event's "Medical Centre"), numerous volunteering students, technical staff and teachers formed an actual team supporting the organization of the largest university sporting





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event. UNISA was the only university to host the largest sporting and student event within its premises in its campuses, thus allowing the local community to live first-hand the atmosphere and the excitement of the game. The **universiade.unisa.it** portal hosted the daily and real-time account of the event, gathering contents and pictures of what was undoubtedly the most lively sports and youth festival in Italy and Campania. Seizing the 2019 Universiade opportunity, the University has succeeded in creating a new sport complex (Unisa Sports Village), handed over to the university and the local community for the valorization and growth of Campania's sports talents in the world.

GUIDE TO THE UNIVERSITY OF SALERNO 2019 - 2020 THE CAMPUS OF ART

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For a number of years now, the Fisciano university campus has been promoting and welcoming architectural projects and contemporary artworks in its interior and exterior spaces. Such a commitment has grown and consolidated over the years, beginning in 1991 with the installation of "Mnemata" by Pietro Lista, a bronze assembly of twelve elements that preserves the memory of the peasant locations on which University of Salerno was built. With "Furia Selvaggia" (Wild Fury) dating back to 1975, the Fisciano campus welcomes the work of Umberto Mastroianni, a brilliant and eclectic and Italian sculptor of the 20th century. His works are reminiscent of monumental sculpture in the use of abstract structural patterns of cubist-futurist derivation

The large sheet iron sculpture, donated by Mastroianni's heirs in 2001, confirms the artist's connection with the linear and dynamic structures of his peculiar sculptural language.

In 2006, the University entrusted Ettore Sottsass Jr. and Enzo Cucchi with the rearranging of the area between the Rettorato building and the Great Hall. The two artists designed the "Chiostro della Pace" (Cloister of Peace), a 21mx30m structure covered by four long slightly sloping blue ceramic plates resting on large steel pillars covered with gray, blue, black and white stones. Inside are four fountain sculptures in glazed ceramic and terracotta by Enzo Cucchi - "Sphere with skulls", "Horse Head", "Mountain with Skulls", "Bust of a Supine Man" – donated by the Comune di Salerno. Provincia di Salerno and Regione Campania. Sottsass Jr's design, together with Cucchi's sculptures, received the PAALMA Award at the Triennale di Milano in 2008. In 2013, the Cloister underwent important restoration works, carried out under the supervision of Maria Passaro. In 2007, inside the university chapel, Paolo Cibelli created the sculpture "Legni Parlanti" (Talking Woods) by carving an altar and a lectern from an ultra-centenarian olive tree trunk. The campus community today can also enjoy "Orizzonte Due" (Horizon Two), an imposing site-specific sculpture in steel and glass by Greek artist Costas Varotsos. located at the campus' south entrance and realized as part the national exhibition project "L'Albero della Cuccagna, Nutrimenti

dell'Arte", curated by Achille Bonito Oliva. For the campus, the artist thought up a "horizon" in reference to the future, a symbol of the inexhaustible and unsettling wealth of reality. It is composed of a slender, sinuous, corrugated steel ribbon featuring two curves touching the ground filled with strips of glass, reminiscent of water flowing in vases and then immediately returning to the ground, whereby every tree is nourished. A tree extending horizontally. Varotsos' sculpture is loosely based on the theme of the Albero della Cuccagna (Greasy Pole), according to the concept of the exhibition curated by Achille Bonito Oliva. In 2018, Rotondi-based Neapolitan artist Lucio Perone designed "Ombre" (Shadows). a steel and fiberglass sundial placed in Piazza del Sapere. A reference to history, art. craftsmanship and science, this piece of art tells the time of day based on the apparent motion of the sun in the sky. The acquisition of new public art works has therefore increased over the years, and has found its future development in the project "Art on Campus, OverAll, in situ and in

Cloister of Peace

Design: Ettore Sottsass Jr. (Innsbruck, 1917 – Milan, 2007) Fountain sculptures by Enzo Cucchi (Ancona, 1949) Fisciano campus

Year of completion: February - October 2005 Designed by Ettore Sottsass Jr., the "Chiostro della Pace" (Cloister of Peace) houses four sculptures by Enzo Cucchi. The architectural and sculptural work - awarded in 2008 with PAALMA (Artist Award + La Marrana Arteambiente Architect) at the Triennale di Milano - was conceived as a place for dialogue between architecture and art, and as a home for all forms of knowledge. It consists of a small and hospitable garden space – 21m x 30m – covered by a roof of four sloping plates with blue ceramic tiles which intersect one another like the delicate pages of a book. It features two olive trees in the centre and four fountain sculptures placed located at the openings of the white ceramic low walls surrounding the cloister.

After the figurative beginnings in the 1930s, the work of Umberto Mastroianni (Fontana Liri, 1910 - Marino, 1998) was influenced by the climate of novelty and experimentation that came about in Italy after World War II. Since the early 1950s, the artist absorbed and reflected some suggestions of the neo-cubist patterns and the abstract/concrete and material poetics of Informalism.

Furia Selvaggia is the combination of differently shaped pieces of sheets put on top of each other.

Pietro Lista

The visual world of Pietro Lista (Castiglion del Lago, Perugia, 1941, based in Fisciano) is characterized by continuous experimentation on techniques and materials. The title of the installation "Mnemata" refers to the memory of the peasant locations where the University was built. In the words of the artist: "I witnessed the setting of the foundation stone of the University in Fisciano and the tearing down of some farms, where I recovered tables, stairs and shoes. It was natural for me to build a tribute to these traces. Mnemata is a bronze sculpture assembling twelve elements, including an old table, a straw chair, a pair of shoes and a cherry tree. In all, there are twelve elements, like the apostles, the months of the year, symbols that recur in my practice as an artist".



Paolo Cibelli

Legni parlanti (Talking woods) Wooden altar (200 x 100 x 90 cm) Wooden lectern (130 x 50 x 60 cm) Fisciano campus University Chapel Donated by the artist, 2007

Paolo Cibelli (Torre Annunziata, 1949, based in Salerno) learned sculpture as an autodidact, gaining attention from the public and critics for his ability to work a single material: wood. He is known for hunting tree trunks and blackened, weathered pieces of wood. Inside the campus chapel, the lectern and altar of the *Legni Parlanti* series were carved by the artist from an ultra-centenarian olive trunk. The lectern, left deliberately rough and slightly carved with its accentuated curves and knots, is paired with the altar frontal, decorated with a fragmented image of a Last Supper.



Costas Varotsos

Energy, space and time are the elements characterizing the work of Costas Varotsos (Athens, 1955, living and working between Athens and the island of Aegina). He is known for its site-specific sculptures, made of iron or steel and especially glass, located outdoors in various parts of the world. Orizzonte Due is a large corrugated line of steel that holds overlapping strips of glass on the two ends, reminiscent of water in vases. A sculpture oriented to the horizon, or rather "two" horizons.

Lucio Perone (Naples, 1972, based in Rotondi). He began his career giving life to a repertoire of objects of daily use or taken from nature, such as pencils, power outlets, little men, ants, establishing himself on the art scene since the beginning of 2000 due to a strong, playful, ironic charge, reminding of the great pop sculptures of American master Claes Oldenburg.

Ombre is an "auteur sundial" shaped like a giant red pencil that "captures" sunlight and projects it over the winter time hours (painted in white) and the summer time hours (painted in red) supported by a little black man, on the floor of the Piazza del Sapere.
