

MY MIND MATTERS TOO

Meg Wamithi, a student at King's, created 'My Mind Matters Too' to help young people suffering with mental health issues. The team have adapted the project to ensure young people continue to receive mental health support by hosting Tea and Talk sessions on Zoom, opening up conversation about mental health as well as sharing practical support during COVID-19.

DIGITAL CULTURES OF #COVID-19

The Department of Digital Humanities are working with media organisations at the First Draft Coalition to co-develop digital methods to investigate what the WHO has called an "infodemic" of COVID-19 misinformation. This builds on approaches from new media studies, science and technology studies, as well as previous collaborations such as the Field Guide to "Fake News".

APP DEVELOPMENT

King's launched an app aiming to control the outbreak of COVID-19 by allowing anyone to report symptoms. This is helping researchers determine how fast the virus is spreading in a particular area in real time. By understanding the symptoms linked to health conditions, both high-risk areas and those most at risk can be identified. The millions of users that have participated have helped to identify hotspots across the UK.

STUDENT VISA

If you are a student from outside the UK, it is likely that you will need to apply for a Student Visa. Once you receive your unconditional offer to study at King's, from June onwards we will issue you with a Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS) which you will need to make your visa application. In support of your application, you are required to show you have sufficient funds to cover your tuition fees and maintenance (for yourself and any dependants in the UK).

Following the departure of the UK from the European Union, EEA and Swiss students are likely to require a visa to enter and study in the UK unless they already have pre-settled or settled status in the UK as part of the EU Settlement Scheme. Details of the new UK immigration route are currently being finalised and should be available on our webpages from autumn 2020.

DEGREE-AWARDING POWERS
