



RESEARCH IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Arsenic in rice

Led by Professor Jörg Feldmann, a team from the University of Aberdeen developed methodologies for measuring the levels of inorganic arsenic in rice. After implementing tests on products worldwide, the team discovered that levels were significantly higher in the USA than in countries such as Bangladesh, due to the herbicides used by the USA in fields where rice is grown. But although the team's findings attracted significant attention from food groups and federations, it was not until China implemented a maximum permissible level for the first time, and introduced a new import regulation, that major food authorities began to act. Based on China's new benchmark, the research team demonstrated that many European products, including baby rice, did not pass the new regulatory limit.

As a result of this research, the World Health Organisation (WHO) and the UN's Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) came together to examine contaminants in rice and consider the team's suggestions for a maximum permissible level of inorganic arsenic. In 2016, these recommendations were implemented when the EU introduced new laws to regulate the levels of inorganic arsenic in rice.

RECEIVING A DECISION

You will be sent an email with our decision. If there are conditions attached to the offer, please upload requested documents to the Applicant Portal as soon as possible.



IDENTIFY FUNDING OPTIONS

Most funding bodies have application deadlines, so we advise that you submit your funding application as early as possible. It is important that you have an offer from the University before you apply for funding, so you need to get your application to us well before the funding body's closing date: abdn.ac.uk/funding



ACCEPTING YOUR OFFER

If you wish to accept the offer, please return your completed acceptance and financial guarantee forms as soon as possible. If you are waiting to hear the outcome of a funding application, you can still accept the offer of admission then send the completed financial guarantee form with the letter of sponsorship later.



REVIEW YOUR JOINING PACK

Once cleared for admission you will receive a pack of joining instructions which includes a Certificate of Acceptance, information on accommodation, registration, tuition fees etc. International students who declare they require a Tier 4 visa to enter the UK will receive a CAS number so that they may apply.



The requirement for most programmes is a second-class UK Honours degree (or equivalent) in an appropriate discipline from an approved university. Some programmes have more specific requirements. Undergraduate English language

There is a set minimum entry requirement for your level of English to ensure you have sufficient language skills to cope with your studies. An IELTS Academic overall score of 6.0 is required for admission in to an undergraduate programme. Medical students require an IELTS Academic overall score of 7.0.

Postgraduate English requirements

Our postgraduate English entry requirements can differ depending on the area of study. The baseline requirement for postgraduate study is an IELTS score of 6.5 or above.

International Study Centre

If you don't meet the academic entry requirements for your chosen degree, you have the option of taking a foundation pathway. Our International Study Centre is located in the heart of the Old Aberdeen campus, so you'll be studying within the grounds of the university.

Foundation Programme

The centre will provide you with one or two years of study, which upon successful completion can provide entry to year 2 (after the one year foundation programme) or year 3 (after a 2 year foundation programme) of an undergraduate degree respectively.

Pre-Masters Programme

Our Pre-Masters Programme deepens your academic knowledge and improves your English language skills through university-style tuition. You'll also develop your career skills, gain international experience and gain practical tools for professional success. This 12 week programme is delivered on campus, in our International Study Centre.

THE LANGUAGE **CENTRE**

If you do not meet the University's English language requirement, the language centre can help. The centre provides intensive English language courses that can help you meet the condition of your offer and help develop your knowledge and use of English further.

Tuition fees

Fixed fees

Our fixed fee structure means that new international undergraduate (excluding Medicine) and postgraduate research students commencing study from 2020/21 are charged the same tuition fee each year, for the duration of their programme of study.

Many other universities increase their fees between 5% and 9% every year. The University of Aberdeen is committed to ensuring that international students can project their costs in advance of arriving in Aberdeen. Our fixed fee structure will allow you to plan ahead and save money!

Undergraduate tuition fees

Your tuition fees will depend on the degree you have chosen. For 20/21 entry, our undergraduate artsbased programmes start at £17,200 and our undergraduate sciencebased programmes start at £19,700 (excluding medicine and dentistry). For more information, please visit our website.

Undergraduate Arts Degree (MA)

An international student starting our undergraduate Master of Arts in Business Management in September 2020 would pay their tuition fees as follows:

Year 1 - £17,200

Year 2 - £17.200 (no increase in fees)

Year 3 - £17,200 (no increase in fees)

Year 4 - £17,200 (no increase in fees)

Total cost of tuition for a four year degree is £68,800.

Undergraduate Engineering Degree

An international student starting our Bachelor of Engineering in September 2020 would pay their tuition fees as follows:

Year 1 - £19,700

Year 2 - £19,700 (no increase in fees)

Year 3 - £19,700 (no increase in fees)

Year 4 - £19,700 (no increase in fees)

Total cost of study for a four year degree is £78,800.







International

Living costs?

Students who require a visa to study in Scotland need to show evidence that they have enough funds to maintain themselves without earnings from work whilst studying. In addition to tuition fees, students require a further £1015 per month to cover their living costs. As part of your Tier 4 visa application students are also required to pay a health surcharge to have access to the National Health Service (NHS). For further information on this, please visit:

ATAS

Please note that overseas applicants for some science, engineering or technology disciplines may require an Academic Technology Approval Scheme (ATAS) certificate. The ATAS certificate must be obtained before applying for a student Entry Clearance or VISA. You can submit an ATAS application up to six months before the programme start date, even if the offer is still conditional.
