If your English language test score is below the required minimum, the University offers another opportunity - a one or two-semester Prerequisite Intensive Module in English (PRIME).

The purpose of PRIME is to help students improve their academic English language skills and prepare them for studies at LCC International University. To qualify for PRIME your score must be from TOEFL ITP - 420, TOEFL IBT - 36, and IELTS - 5.0



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An education is an investment that comes with future rewards. 
# STUDENT LIFE: HOLISTIC APPROACH


