IELTS: min. score of 6.5 and min. sub-scores of 6.0


A degree completed through the English medium may exempt candidates from taking an English language test. In this case applicants will have to provide a sample of academic writing (e.g. thesis).

Programme description

Cities are at the heart of economic, social and political innovation. The master's specialisation in Urban Governance is part of the MSc in Public Administration of the Erasmus University Rotterdam. It is developed by the Department of Public Administration (Erasmus School of Social and Behavioural Sciences, ESSB), which has an excellent reputation in governance studies and public management, and the Institute of Housing and Urban Development Studies (IHS), which is an award-winning institute (UN-Habitat Scroll of Honour) with more than 60 years of experience in educating and training local and national governments officials.

The programme is designed to help students to develop interdisciplinary expertise in analysing and tackling urban governance issues. In addition, in the urban governance labs, students are trained to design and manage specific governance strategies, in the end advising practitioners in the fie<mark>ld. - Working for a **non-profit organization**, such as a housing corporation or a big social enterprise working on neighborhood development;
- Policy consultant or advisor working for a consultancy firm dealing with urban development issues or designing co-production processes
