PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The curricula of the master programmes ensure a balance between knowledge and skills that is in line with the requirements of the modern business world. General subjects, like project management and research, provide a solid basis to build on, to then focus and go more in depth into the subjects specific to your master.

The classes are interactive, practice oriented, and challenge you to take an active role in the programme.

Throughout the year, our students develop their personal leadership skills and work in Living Labs and so called Pressure Cooker weeks on real life company assignments.

During the year, you may join a number of company visits, besides working with companies in actual business challenges. This way you get a taste of the real world and grow your network.

NVAO ACCREDITATION

The Master programmes are accredited by the NVAO (Dutch-Flemish Accreditation Organisation). The NVAO also certified our programmes with a special feature; The Quality Mark Sustainable Higher Education at the level of 3 stars.

LECTURERS

Our lecturers are a reflection of the international classroom. You will be taught by a multinational mix of experts in the field of supply chain management and consultancy. Our lecturers have years of professional experience in multinational companies and hold a master's or doctoral degree.

This combination of academic knowledge and practical experience provides you with the benefit of seeing how theory is applied in practice.

STUDY LOAD

Our programmes consist of four study blocks. The curriculum of a master programme consists of a coherent set of subjects, reflecting the profile of the

study programme. If you have mastered the subject matter and pass your exam/assignment, you will receive credits for this subject.

One credit reflects 28 hours of study per subject. The number of credits to be achieved therefore depends on the number of lectures, the number of self-study hours and the time needed to prepare for the exams and assignments. The total study load (in credits) for the entire master programme is 60 credits.




What do you think of RBS and RUAS as a general university?


How does the pre-master programme prepare you for your degree?

"Before entering the master, I completed my bachelor's (in Dutch) at the same university. I worked and travelled for two years but I always felt I did not have enough expertise in entrepreneurship. Another reason why I chose this programme was due to the international environment, I had contacted alumni of this Master programme over LinkedIn and found out it was very international and there was a strong team environment.

When I began the programme, I had the opportunity to meet and work with different nationalities and add an intercultural dimension to my studies, something that was lacking in my last course. The main highlight from this programme was the practical approach to learning, it helped us gain experience in order to enter the working field. Applying the theoretical studies to actual companies helped me learn as I am not someone who can be in books all day.

The international environment is a unique point for this university (for both Dutch and international students) along with the practical learning approach. This approach helps develop soft skills such as communication, presenting and project reports in combination with the study into Consultancy and Entrepreneurship. Even though a challenge this year was the changing curriculum and structure, it shows and enforces adaptation.

I aim to be an entrepreneur in about five years, I had the choice to make a business plan or business case for my thesis, which I was able to use to build skills to reach my short and long term goals. Now moving on into the work field, having this Master, in contrast to a taught programme, I have strength and the upper hand in the job market. I am currently looking for a job in an international internal environment or global Dutch business, where I can work in another country and seek a new opportunity.

Currently I am working as a business developer for a company that helps governments and large enterprises with digital transformations."


OUR FACILITIES

ACCOMMODATION

RUAS reserves approximately 220 rooms per year from Stichting Studenten Huisvesting (Foundation for Student Housing, SSH). For those who are not eligible for SSH rooms, we can provide you with clear and honest information about how to find a room, via our website.



STUDENT GUIDANCE

PRACTICAL & ENROLMENT INFORMATION

STEPS TO YOUR ENROLMENT

- 1 APPLY & REGISTER THROUGH STUDIELINK.NL
- 2 Send us the required certified documents via email for evaluation. Original documents in German or French are accepted. Documents in other languages need to be translated into English.
- 3 Within 3-4 weeks of registering you will receive an invitation to complete the next steps of your enrolment, this also includes an online interview to talk about your motivation and answer questions you might have.
- 4 After a positive evaluation you will receive the conditional admission letter. Your admission is finalised after we have received your original documents (payment & visa approved).
- 5 After payment, we will apply for your student visa on your behalf (only for non-EU/EEA nationalities).
- 6 Arrange your travel & accommodation (for non-EU/ EEA only after receiving the travel visa).
- 7 Supply us with your original documents during introduction week and we will introduce you to the city and assist you with all required legal matters in Rotterdam.
