TIAS Scholarships for Future Leaders (3-10 awards)

Please submit an essay (max 750 words) on 'Leadership in an era of Globalization. Please draw on your own experiences in your answer and not on general, broad statements. We are looking for essays that are personal, creative, and demonstrate leadership. In addition, we are looking for relevancy and how your suggestions could be implemented.

TIAS Scholarships for Women in Business; with preference given to developing countries. (minimum of 8 awards)

Please submit an essay (max 1000 words) on your perception of the influence of gender in business in general. Please also mention a (business) woman you admire and explain why.

TIAS Scholarships for Business & Society; with preference given to developing countries. (4-12 awards)

Please submit an essay (max 1000 words) on what drives your passion for social responsibility and leadership. Emphasize on what your ambitions are in this area and why you believe the TIAS International Full-Time MBA program will help you achieve these ambitions.

TIAS Scholarships for Graduates of Tilburg University and Eindhoven University of Technology. (5-7 awards)

Briefly describe (in no more than 700 words) an instance or aspect in your life to date that has made you stand out amongst your peers or that you consider exceptional in one way or another. In addition, also please (a) state why you feel an MBA at TIAS is relevant to your particular career needs, and (b), particularly at this stage of your career.

How scholarship decisions are made?

When making scholarship decisions, the TIAS admissions board reviews all application materials submitted by candidates and assesses each candidate's overall qualities: the academic profile, the strength of overall admissions application, quality of admissions interview, and employability. Like our admissions decisions, all scholarship decisions are made by the admissions board using a comprehensive approach that takes into account a variety of personal criteria, including educational achievement; life experiences; personal interests; location of residence; student's goals and background, and GMAT score. Please remember that a high GMAT score does not guarantee admission, just as a low score doesn't preclude admission. We accept students with lower GMAT scores if we believe this can be offset by stronger areas in one's profile. Since we are such a very diverse school, we are keen to see whether you have worked, lived, studied abroad, or worked for an international company. So while a solid GMAT score is important, it is not necessarily a deal breaker.
