




A tale of two cities

Leiden University is located in two amazing locations. Medieval and quaint, Leiden is the founding city and heart of the university. A short 10-minute train journey away is our second home; The Hague. Our teaching and research in the international city of peace, justice and security reflect the themes that are important to this centre of government and international diplomacy.



Come to the Netherlands: the gateway to Europe

Inspiring and relaxed – these are qualities that perfectly describe the Netherlands. At the same time, there is much more to say about the country. The Netherlands is one of the safest countries in the world (Global Peace Index 2021), we are 2nd on the list of happiest countries in the world (OECD Better Life Index), and the Dutch have the best English proficiency in Europe (English Proficiency Index) making the Netherlands a perfect study destination!

Typical Dutch

Visionary architecture, cutting edge design, street markets selling rainbows of fresh flowers, *haring* (raw herring), *stroopwafels* (caramel-syrup-filled waffles), cheese, and *borrel* ('drinks') at canal-side cafés are just some of the reasons to love the Netherlands. Living in Holland means you can enjoy the culture of historical cities like Leiden, Amsterdam and Delft, while also experiencing bustling, modern and international cities like Rotterdam and The

Hague. Did you know that Holland has the largest museum density in the world? For instance, visit the Rijksmuseum, the Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam or the Mauritshuis in The Hague. The humble bicycle is one of the favourite means of transportation in the country. A bike will most likely be among your first purchases in the Netherlands and there are over 15,000 kilometers of bicycle paths for you to discover once you get going!

Studying in Holland

The Dutch education system is interactive, student-centred and focused on teamwork, which makes it easy to meet other students. Studying in Holland means developing an open mind and increasing your international orientation. The teaching method at Dutch higher education institutions is founded on respect for each individual's opinions and convictions. This respect is a national virtue that characterises Holland's diverse and pluralistic society. High quality education at low cost

Leiden's history

Situated at what has traditionally been an important junction where waterways and roads intersect, stands a city that will enchant you: Leiden. The city is famous not only for its university, but for its almshouses, museums and glorious history. Rembrandt was born here, and the city inspired many other influential painters. Over the centuries, Leiden continued to attract scientists, and artists. The canals, the historical buildings, the charming narrow lanes, the treasuries of knowledge, culture and science: Leiden has them all for you to explore.

A student city with character

Leiden University has contributed to the city's unique atmosphere for almost 450 years. This historical city became home to the first Dutch university in 1575, and many of the university buildings are still located in the picturesque city centre. The medieval centre of Leiden is full of students, student accommodation and university

buildings. Enjoy the myriad of lovely restaurants and cafés, the venues for theatre, music and film, or the first-class museums. If you want some time off after your academic efforts, you could also take a boat trip on the canals, or spend some time in one of the city's parks. And don't forget the many trendy festivals and other cultural events that are organised in Leiden from January through December, such as the Relief of Leiden on 3 October. It's the biggest event of the year!

Small-scale and central

Leiden is a winning combination of small and fun, yet big in character as a student city. Thanks to its compact layout it's never more than a short bike ride from your accommodation to your faculty, and you're more or less guaranteed to meet someone you know along the way. What's more, it's also centrally located between the Netherlands' main cities. With a little effort, you can cycle to the beach in 30 minutes, while Amsterdam, Rotterdam

and Utrecht can all be reached within 45 minutes by train. Our second location in The Hague is only a 10-minute train ride away as well!

Innovative city

Leiden is home to the Leiden Bio Science Park, which is the location of international organisations and corporations that are often spin-offs of Leiden University research. The European Space Agency is located not far from Leiden as well.

A coffee with the prime minister

With the most historic sites per square metre in the Netherlands, The Hague oozes culture and history. Gazing straight into the eyes of Vermeer's *Girl with a Pearl Earring* at the Mauritshuis museum is just a beautiful, five-minute-walk away from losing all sense of

perspective at Escher in Het Paleis. Go on from there to discover Madurodam, where you'll find the whole of the Netherlands at your feet.

Are you more of a city person? Or more inclined to seek out nature? Why choose between city and beach, when The Hague offers both? You can even smell the sea from the heart of the historic city centre. The Hague has eleven kilometres of sandy beach within cycling distance of the historic city centre. These weeks are not only functional, where you will learn about your faculty and other practical matters, but they can serve as the foundation for your social and professional network at Leiden University. They are not to be missed! Feel at home in your new city before starting your classes:

- DOWL (Orientation Week Leiden): Experience everything the city has to offer, participate in fun activities and meet lots of new people. You will get to learn more about university life and organise some practical things such as getting a bike!
- HOP Week (The Hague Orientation Programme): Feel the pulse of the bustling city of The Hague! Get started with lots of fun, information on the city and the university life, as well getting to know your fellow students.

How to feel at home quickly

Admission and application for international students

Admission to master's programmes is based on several requirements. Our step-by-step guide will give you the necessary help and guidance in submitting your application.







Admission to a master's programme is specific and based on academic, programme-specific and language requirements.

Academic requirements

The minimum requirement for admission to any master's programme is a relevant BA or BSc degree (or equivalent) with good results from a recognised research university. If you do not meet the requirements, in some cases a pre-masters programme may be offered. Please note that pre-masters are not available for all programmes and not all pre-masters are taught in English. Check this on the programme's webpage.

Language requirements

As almost all master's programmes are taught in English, you will be asked to submit proof of your English proficiency. Please note that test result may not be more than two years old. Requirements vary per programme. See the website for more information. Accepted tests* are:

- ▶ International English Language Testing System (IELTS): Academic module
- ▶ Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL internet-based)
- ▶ Cambridge English Exam (C2 Proficiency (CPE) or C1 Advanced (CAE)) depending on the admission requirements of the study programme

Programme-specific requirements

The entry requirements for each master's programme vary, particularly with regard to your qualifications. They may include specific academic or professional experience and motivation, or specific course requirements. You can find the details on the website of your chosen programme.

Step 2. Check the application deadlines

The deadlines for application for your chosen master's programme may vary, so please check your programme's webpage. The general application deadlines are:

Non-EU/EEA students, those requiring a student visa or residence permit:



April 1
Septemb September intake



October 15 February intake

EU/EEA students:



May 15
Septemb September intake



December 1 February intake

- ▶ You must complete a two-part application procedure: registering your application(s) in the national system Studielink and applying in Leiden University's online application portal (uSis). This means it will take at least two days to submit your complete application. If you haven't completed these two processes before the deadline, you
- ▶ Scholarship deadlines are usually much earlier; take this into account when planning your application process and check the scholarship website.
- ▶ Other deadlines apply for housing: check our housing website and request housing early.

Collect the required documents

When applying for admission, you will be asked to submit a number of documents. Refer to the programme-specific information for details of the documents required by each study programme.



Step 3. Start your application

- ▶ Choose your programme, and if required, specialisation.
- ▶ Start your application in Studielink and await your activation e-mail for the Leiden University's online application portal (uSis).
- ▶ Activate your (ULCN) Leiden University account and log into our online application portal (uSis).
- ▶ Finalise your application by uploading the necessary documents and answering a few questions. The portal provides an overview of what you need to do to complete your application.
- ▶ After submitting your application, the online portal will, if applicable, ask you if you want to apply for student housing or a scholarship.
- ▶ Pay the €100 application fee, if applicable.
- ▶ The Admissions Office and the Board of Admissions at the faculty will review your application.
- ▶ You will receive the Board of Admissions decision within 6-8 weeks of the university receiving your complete application.
- ▶ You've been admitted? Accept your offer and check in the online application portal (uSis) whether you need to submit any documents to meet your conditions of admission. Instructions on how to do so will be provided in uSis.

Visa and residence permit

If you come from a non-EU/EEA country, you will need a visa and/or a residence permit. Our staff at the Admissions Office will apply for these documents on your behalf. They will contact you once you have been admitted to a master's programme, have applied for or secured accommodation, and after you have submitted proof that you have sufficient funds to support yourself during your study period.


Pay your tuition fees

Financial matters

Tuition fees

Your tuition fee depends on your chosen programme, your nationality (EU/EEA or non-EU/EEA) and whether you have previously completed a master's degree in the Netherlands. Please check per programme to be sure of your fee.

Cost of living

It is important to make sure that you have sufficient funds for the entirety of your studies. If you are a non-EEA student, the Dutch Immigration and Naturalisation Service will require you to submit proof of this in order to approve your visa or residence permit.

Leiden University Excellence Scholarship

This competitive scholarship programme is designed for excellent non-EU/EEA students enrolling in a master's programme and for students of all nationalities enrolling in an Advanced LLM programme or the MSc in International Relations and Diplomacy. The award can cover a substantial part of the tuition fee. Living expenses are not included in this scholarship.

Other scholarships

In addition, there is limited number of other scholarships available for students from specific regions of the world, or for specific programmes. Please check the scholarship site for details.

Loans

Leiden University accepts the US SallieMae Smart Option loan. If you have EU/EEA or Swiss nationality and are under 30, you may be eligible for a loan from the Dutch government to cover your tuition fees.

Working while studying

Do you need to find a paid job to cover some of your expenses while studying in the Netherlands? While finding employment is not impossible, it may well prove a difficult task. Working for the university is a possibility, and can be arranged through our JobMotion office. However, only a limited number of positions are available each year. Many jobs outside of the university require a good command of Dutch, and depending on your

nationality, you will face some restrictions. If you are from an EU/EEA country, from Switzerland or Japan, you will not need a work permit. All other nationalities require a special work permit and can only work for a maximum of sixteen hours a week. This information is subject to change, so check the current rules when looking for employment. All in all, we advise you not to rely on finding a paid job when financially planning your study costs.

Housing

Universities in the Netherlands do not own the accommodation that is available to students, and as such, Leiden University cannot guarantee housing for incoming students. Most students will rent a room or share facilities in an apartment or house with fellow students. As Leiden University is an urban campus, student housing is spread throughout the cities of Leiden and The Hague, as well as the surrounding areas. The cities themselves are our campus. Finding accommodation in either city can be difficult. We recommend that you start your search as soon as you can, as it is your responsibility to find a room prior to your arrival. There are two main ways to find accommodation:

Find housing the Dutch way!

House hunting in the Netherlands can be challenging, so we strongly recommend starting as early as possible. You may be unfamiliar with procedures and prices; websites and advertisements are often in Dutch. On our Finding housing yourself webpage you can access up-to-date information, intended to help international students to find accommodation and avoid possible pitfalls. You can independently look for housing via private landlords or housing associations. There are a number of housing organisations that can assist, such as DUWO. Social media platforms are also a good source to help find options and possible roommates. The housing website offers a list of tips and tricks for finding housing on

Housing Office

You can also apply for a housing offer through the university Housing Office. The Leiden University Housing Office reserves a limited number of rooms each year for international students who apply early enough. Here you will be assisted in finding accommodation in Leiden or The Hague. Accommodation ranges in location, size, number of people with whom you share facilities and rental fees. Our advice: due to limited availability, the university cannot guarantee accommodation to all students who request housing. Accommodation is allocated on a first-come first-served basis, according to the date we have received the housing fee, so request housing early and pay the housing fee! There's no need to await the outcome of your application for admission.

Residence Life Programme

In a number of housing locations there are Residence Assistants (RAs) to help international students feel at home in Leiden and The Hague. They aim to bring students together, create a sense of community and foster a safe and tolerant living environment. They also offer support in practical and personal matters, and can refer you to Leiden University's wide range of professional support staff if required.





Leiden Leadership Programme (ILLP)

The LLP provides participants with the necessary knowledge, insights, and skills about leadership to enhance the impact they have on society. The programme runs from November to June and is open to master's students from our university as well as Delft University of Technology and Erasmus University Rotterdam. This intensive extracurricular course is done alongside the regular master's programme and requires substantial motivation and dedication. Students who are admitted, learn how to make an impact through lectures by scientists and professionals in the field, skills training, and a practical assignment. The latter enables participants to tackle a topical problem put forward by the LLP's partner organisations. This programme invites applications from both Dutch-speaking and international students.

Dual master's programme

This involves embarking upon two different university degrees at the same time. They can be complementary, or, they can be very different from one another. However, it is crucial that you obtain approval of the faculties involved. Please note that there may be an additional tuition fee involved.

Research master's programmes

Most faculties offer two-year research master's programmes, which are more intensive than the regular master's programmes. They are designed for highly motivated students, and are a good preparation for a PhD study.

Advanced master's programmes

The Leiden University Law School offers these in-depth programmes which cover a specific area of legal expertise. Designed for excellent students with legal experience and qualified lawyers who wish to enhance their career prospects, classes are small and students benefit from close contact with professors and expert practitioners from the relevant legal field.

Study or internship abroad

Some programmes may allow you to follow a study abroad or internship abroad. This is an extra challenge for the most qualified students.

If you choose to do an internship or to follow part of your Leiden study programme outside of the Netherlands, you may be eligible to apply for a grant covering part of the costs. This is possible through the Erasmus+ scheme for study, research or a traineeship in a European country, or through Leiden University Lustra+ scheme. Lustra+ is intended for study, internship or research at an institution or in a company outside Europe.

Non-Degree and Study Abroad/Exchange

If you are currently enrolled at one of Leiden University's partner institutions, you can apply for an exchange semester/year in Leiden. This has the advantage that you will pay tuition fees only at your home university. Leiden University participates in the Erasmus+ programme and the International Student Exchange Programs (ISEP). In addition, we have bilateral agreements with over 70 distinguished partner institutions. Leiden University currently offers exchange opportunities in nearly 20 fields.

We recommend that you contact the exchange (or studyabroad) coordinator at your home institution to determine whether you are eligible to participate in an exchange programme.

Study Abroad

If there is no exchange agreement between Leiden University and your home institution, you have the option to apply for a Study Abroad programme for one or two semesters instead. Within this context, you will be able to create your own programme or choose a selection of courses taught in English to match your academic background and interests. Alternatively, you can also participate in programmes that are especially tailored for students with a particular interest

in law, Dutch language and culture, or biomedical sciences. Leiden University does charge tuition fees for these programmes.



Air and Space Law (Advanced LL.M.)









The LL.M. programme in Air and Space Law combines public air law, private air law and space law. It has a clearly defined European and international dimension, making it unique in the world. In this intensive one-year master's programme, you will gain a solid legal foundation in this exciting field, learning from some of the foremost experts in academia and legal practice.

Career

Many of our graduates find positions in law firms or consulting firms with an aviation and space law practice, legal departments of airports, airlines and aerospace companies, civil aviation authorities, ministries of transportation, space organisations like the European Space Agency and academia. This part-time programme is also aimed at professionals in the working field. It involves 2-3 days of self-study per week, plus on Friday live working groups.
